

Staff aim to share positively with parents in all aspects of their child's development and parents are encouraged to take an active interest in the life of the nursery. Staff enable parents to understand how they can contribute best to extending their child's learning, both in the Nursery and at home.

Parents and children have an opportunity to visit the Nursery/meet the staff in June, before the child begins his/her Nursery education.
